

It has been a brilliant week back in Year 2! We have explored our new classroom and are becoming more confident in accessing all of the areas and resources we have. Sunny the class meerkat has already started his adventures and has had a wonderful first weekend! All of the Year 2 children will have the opportunity to spend time with Sunny over the year.

This week we have been learning about the artist Anthony Browne and exploring his drawings. He likes to make artwork of different monkeys and includes these as illustrations in his books. They have experimented with different drawing techniques and how the pressure they put on their pencil effects the lightness or darkness.



We have also been learning about living things and their habitats and have set up an investigation to explore the question: Do plants need light to grow. We put one plant in the windowsill to get light and one plant in a cupboard to see which one grows. We made predictions on what we thought would happen to the plants. We will observe them over time and record what we notice.

We have many exciting plans for this term, including making our own 'healthy pizzas' in DT and experimenting with different instruments in Music. We also have PE every Thursday, so please make sure all kits are in school!


Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the year!

This half term we will be putting our talents in Netball and Dance to work in PE on Tuesdays!


Miss Wall and Mrs Beck can't wait to have a brilliant year learning and growing with you.

Please remember that if your child(ren) are unwell and will not be attending school, please make sure you contact the school to inform them **each** day they are absent.

Excellent attendance at school matters.

Good attendance is classed as "at least 95%" - that is less than 9 days off across a school year. A letter was sent this week outlining national changes to poor attendance. In summary:

- Parents must inform school of every absence and the reason for this.
- Schools must inform parents of their children's attendance rate and work with families to improve attendance.
- Holidays should not be authorised.
- Unauthorised absences of 5 days+ (either 5 continuous days or 5 separate days in a 10-week period) are liable to a fine of £160 per parent, per child. (reduced to £80, if paid within 21 days)
- If there is a second period of 5 days+ absence in <u>3 years</u> an increased fine of £160 per child, per parent is charged and not reduced.
- A third period of unauthorised absence could lead to legal prosecution. This is also likely if fines are unpaid.
- Fines are <u>per child, per parent</u>. This means that a biological parent of a child is fined, even if he/she does not live with that child.

We will always provide as much support as we can to parents who are struggling to ensure their children attend school regularly. However, if we do not see improvements or holidays are taken, we will have to follow Government guidelines in issue fines.

TIMINGS AND DROP OFF ARRANGEMENTS

As we begin to establish new routines, please can I remind you that the school day begins at 8.45am. At this time, lessons have started and the children are in classes learning. If you wish to talk to the class teacher, please allow time before this or alternatively organise an appointment through the office, and we will be happy to accommodate your request. Children who arrive in school after 9.30am are recorded as absent for the first session. Please be mindful that missed sessions directly link into government policy on fining.

Whilst we appreciate that parking is challenging around the school site, we are unable to offer use of the centre as a car park for drop-offs. The school has a handful of spaces available for staff, but we have been asked to ensure that the car park is free for people who are using the centre. Where possible, sharing lifts or walking are effective options, however, if you need to drive, please can we ask that you do not park in centre. Staff will be monitoring this.



School Lunch Orders and sQuid

Thank-you to everyone who has managed to order lunches via sQuid. We are so sorry that the technology has had so many problems.

The following groups of children need their parents/carers to order EVERY DAY and preferably at least a week in advance.

- All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2
- Children who are entitled to Free School Meals in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6

If you pay for your child's meal, please only order for the days that he/she is eating. If you order and they don't eat, you will still be charged as you are required to pre-pay.

THERE ARE STILL A LOT OF CHILDREN WHO HAVE NO ORDERS. Last week, we were able to allow children to eat what they wanted, but this will not continue as too much food must be over produced and then wasted.

Children without orders will be fed, but this will only be a jacket potato or sandwich.

If you are still having problems, check that you have updated the sQuid app with the latest version – you may need to uninstall and reinstall again.

Outstanding payments:

Please can we ask that you check and clear any outstanding payments on sQuid.

As we move forward, this is a reminder that booking functions require prepayment.

In order to book in future, all outstanding payments must be cleared.
