NURSERY

My house and where I live...

The past 2 weeks in Nursery, we have been learning about our houses and where we live. The children have shown real enthusiasm towards our topic and have really enjoyed showing their peers pictures of their houses.

We have learnt all about different houses including flats, bungalows and chalets and different types such as terraced, semi-detached, detached, etc. We discussed as a class what differences there are between a flat and house and we worked together to identify the windows, door, garage and chimney. The children have worked hard to remember where we live and are now keen to tell their peers and adults that they live in Worcester.



We have been focusing on The Three Little Pigs as our topic story and the children have enjoyed role playing and re-telling the story. They have also had a go at making their own houses out of bricks, straw and sticks.

The children have made many different creations of their houses by painting, drawing, junk modelling and sculpting at the playdough station. They have also put their construction hats on and have been busy with the wooden blocks, bricks, boulders and Duplo.

Overall, the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about their houses, and it has been a pleasure to see them being so engaged and enthusiastic towards their learning.











RECEPTION

Reception have been learning all about the season winter. We read the story 'Robin's winter song' and found out that some birds fly away for the winter because it is harder to find food. Reception decided to make some bird seed balls for the birds that are here...hang them in your garden and see what birds you can spot!

In our play, we made caves for bears to hibernate in, played with ice and water, made fake snow and painted some beautiful robins.

In talk for writing, we have been reading and performing the story 'Rosie's Walk'. We have been using positional language to make stories about our own walks.

As geographers, we have been exploring the school, giving directions and making maps of our journey to school.











We are very excited to start learning about Antarctica this term! We will be looking at where Antarctica is located on the globe as well as comparing it to the UK! We will learn lots about penguins over the next few weeks. We reactivated our knowledge of human and physical features and had a go at building some human features of

Antarctica! Check them out!







In Maths, we will be cementing our knowledge of number pairs up to 10 and starting to write the corresponding number sentences. We will also be using a part whole model to add and subtract.

Our focus story is Lost and Found. We have already created our own story map of the story and then we will be changing it to our own version. Keep an eye out for our own versions of the story map that you can practice at home too!

This week we have been developing our skills in swimming. We have been practising moving safely across the pool and using a range of equipment, including floats and noodles.





We have also been learning about Jamaica and learned that it is an island surrounded by the Caribbean Sea. We also learned that Jamaica is in North America and is near lots of other small islands. It is close to the equator, so it is a warm country. Over the next few weeks, we will learn more about Jamaica and its' capital city, Kingston.

In Art, we have been exploring printing and have been using everyday objects to print with to see what effect it has on our paper.

We annotated our prints with how we created them and how well we thought they came out on paper.





We have started ukulele with Mrs Harper, which we are thoroughly enjoying. We have recapped what we learned in Year Three and are excited to build up our skills further.






As athletes, we have started gymnastics. We worked in groups to practice different points of balance using our hands, feet, knees and sometimes elbows!




Since starting Spring Term, Year 6 have settled back in quickly and positively.


As readers, we have enjoyed making connections and reading our new reading text: The lion above the door.




As writers, we have been exploring the use of visual literacy and how a video stimulus can spark imagination for all different types of texts. We have used the video Francis from literacy shed which can be found here: https://www.literacyshed.com/francis.html. The video has supported our discussions in how we can create suspense texts and how we can build up tension within a short piece of writing.



So far, we have written diary entries from Francis herself, and some children have challenged themselves to change formality by writing letters to their grandparents (from Francis's perspective).





We have created a short setting description focusing on building tension using short sentences, rhetorical questions and description. We are looking forward to using the video to write a short story using our senses and show not tell.

As mathematicians, we have begun our fraction unit. As you might be aware, this is one of those trickier units, however the children have shown huge amounts of positive learning attitudes which is making it easier for us to retain the knowledge we need.
